

Very low neighborhood disadvantage score. Only three percent of residents are in poverty. All measures are much lower than the median district.

Very low segregation score.

Definitions

How did we create this index?

The violent crime index is a combination of the violent crime score and the social determinants score. Each score is based on percentiles. A violent crime index of 80 means this district ranks higher than 80% of all districts.

How did we calculate this data for council districts?

Demographic data:

The demographic data used is available by census tract. In order to calculate measures for council districts, we used population weighting to apportion data from census tracts to districts.

Crime data:

IMPD shares address-level crime data through an agreement with The Polis Center, which allows us to pinpoint the district in which each crime occurs and tabulate the crime rate for each district. Police departments for Beech Grove, Lawrence, Speedway, and the Indianapolis Airport Authority do not share address-level data with Polis. To estimate the crime rates for districts covering these areas, we use publicly-available crime rates from the FBI, along with population weighting, to apportion the crimes to each district.

How do we measure segregation?

Multiple studies have indicated that both income segregation and race segregation in large U.S. cities are predictive of violent crime rates, likely as markers of generations of unremediated structural discrimination.¹

The measure of income segregation compares the variation in the earnings of full-time workers within the district to the variation in earnings in the metropolitan area. A score of zero means there is no segregation. This district has the same income mix as the region overall. A score of 100 means there is total segregation. No households would have a neighbor with a different income than its own.

The measure of racial segregation uses only two race groups: black and white residents. A score of zero means each group is equally distributed across the district and there is no segregation. A score of 100 means there is maximum segregation.

Other data notes

The definition of violent crime is based on FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting standards and includes homicide/manslaughter, aggravated assault, rape, attempted rape, and robbery.

Households with public assistance includes cash assistance (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families) and food stamps (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program).
