

Stronger Partners, Brighter Futures Program

CICF partners with Cape Fletcher Associates to offer local charitable fundholders the opportunity to focus on their planned giving program through the Stronger Partners, Brighter Futures initiative. Through the program, organizations with charitable funds at the CICF Collaborative meet monthly over a period of nine months to learn about and advance their planned giving.

The eight organizations that participated in the 2023-2024 cohort set goals for how many solicitations and commitments they hoped to reach by February 2024. All together, they reached \$33.5 million secured through 60 commitments to members of the 2023 cohort.



Major Family Funds

CICF provides personalized support to family foundations, working closely with families and their teams to advance their philanthropic goals.



In 2024, the Glick Fund at CICF, a charitable initiative of Glick Philanthropies, directed 76 grants totaling \$4.3 million to our community's nonprofits. In addition to sustained support to fill critical gaps for community members, Glick Philanthropies also launched a focus to support a healthy democracy through civic engagement, nonprofit journalism, and civil rights protections.



In 2024, CICF expanded its support to the Herbert Simon Family Foundation, reflecting the evolution of a 14-year collaboration aimed at advancing impactful philanthropy that creates more equitable, sustainable, and vibrant communities. As part of this ongoing evolution, Clayton De Fur, previously Senior Advisor to HSFF, was named Executive Director of the Herbert Simon Family Foundation, and two new Program Directors joined the team, Leah Nahmias and Guadalupe "Lupe" Pimentel Solano.



In 2024, the Efroymson Family Fund supported 130+ unique organizations focused on the arts, environment and historic preservation efforts in the Midwest and beyond.



Women's Fund

Women's Fund began as a special interest fund of CICF in 1996. In December 2024, The Women's Fund Advisory Board and CICF Board of Directors approved a plan for Women's Fund to launch as its own independent 501(c) (3).

CICF is proud to have walked alongside Women's Fund on this journey, offering support that evolves with their needs and the changing needs of our community.







Connected Communities

Connected Communities, a CICF initiative, continues to invest in the planning and construction of new trail infrastructure. In addition to the recent completion of the B&O Trail, great progress is being made on the future expansion of Grassy Creek Trail, Fall Creek Trail, Eagle Creek Trail, and the soon to be completed Nickel Plate Trail.

BY Plus: Good People, Good Jobs, Good Careers



To capitalize on the increasing number of rewarding career opportunities in the growing construction industry, CICF partners with Indiana Construction Roundtable Foundation, Home Repairs for Good, and the Indianapolis Legal Aid Society on a collaborative and creative approach to support the construction training and development of underinvested, low income, under represented and under employed individuals within Indianapolis. This program is called BY-Plus.



In 2024, the BY Plus Construction Training initiative conducted 22 cohorts. Registration and recruitment improved due to team training, operational adjustments, and continued social media outreach. 447 students enrolled with 440 graduating the training, a 98.4% graduation rate. 423 of the students earned credentials, meaning they completed all BY Plus Training program requirements and passed all credentialing metrics for NCCER Core and OSHA.



CICF Fund Highlight

Senior Fund

Since its inception in 2005, Central Indiana Senior Fund (CISF), a fund of CICF, has awarded more than \$15 million to approximately 150 senior-serving or senior-focused nonprofits and programs in Central Indiana.

CISF's mission is to support programs and opportunities for low-to-moderate-income older adults (ages 55 and older) with a focus on under-served or isolated populations. In addition to grantmaking, CISF has contracted The Polis Center to explore the data necessary to identify the unique and diverse needs of older adults in Central Indiana through the development of the State of Aging Report.

Ortho Indy Foundation

In 2024, Ortholndy Foundation, a fund of CICF, reached a milestone of awarding \$10 million in grants. Over the past 12 years, the Ortholndy Foundation has provided support to numerous nonprofit organizations through its strategic grantmaking process. More than 840 grants have been awarded, benefiting more than 200 grantees. Notably, approximately 700 of these grants have been employee match contributions, totaling around \$1.15 million.

Established in December 2012, the Ortholndy Foundation operates under the guidance of the OIF Advisory Committee in collaboration with CICF.



IMPACT Central Indiana

IMPACT Central Indiana is an investment partnership created by CICF, Hamilton County Community Foundation, and the Indianapolis Foundation. Its goal is to facilitate social impact investments into community-led development projects, undercapitalized entrepreneurs and small businesses, and affordable/workforce housing developments that generate positive and measurable social impact in the community.

2024 Activity Highlight

Since 2016, Tube Factory artspace — a project of the 20-year-old nonprofit Big Car Collaborative — has become a cultural institution in the Garfield Park neighborhood. In 2024, IMPACT Central Indiana contributed a bridge loan to the overall \$9-million construction of a new contemporary art gallery and event space on the grounds of Tube Factory.
